State of Ohio Orders, Restrictions, and Advisories

- Ohio National Guard has been mobilized to support medical operations throughout the State
- Mass gathers over 50 people are banned in the State of Ohio
- Salon barber shops spas and tattoo shops
- Closing all Bureau of Motor Vehicle offices except five across the State
- Ask businesses to monitor employees for symptoms and increase surface cleaning
- Prohibiting all elective surgeries and other medical procedures
- The Primary Election in the State of Ohio has been postponed until June 2, 2020

- All bars and restaurants are ordered closed indefinitely
 - o Restaurants will be allowed to operate carryout services
- All colleges and universities are ordered closed through March 30, 2020
- All K-12 schools are ordered closed effective, Monday, March 16, 2020 through April 3, 2020
 - The school closure order does not currently apply to Ohio's childcare system, such as daycare centers and home-based childcare providers
- Visitation to state psychiatric hospitals by outside visitors are prohibited.
- Visitors to nursing homes are limited to one visitor per day per resident.

Actions Taken to Date

- State of Ohio Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated (March 9, 2020 at 1300 hours)
- Governor DeWine has signed an Executive Order providing immediate unemployment benefits to all workers that do not have access to paid leave from an employer
- Lucas County has transitioned to a Multi-Agency Coordination Center operated out of the Lucas County EOC
- Lucas County EOC activated (March 12, 2020 at 0930 hour)
- An Organization Chart for the Lucas County EOC is attached
- A Communications List providing preferred contact information for all members of the EOC has been completed and is attached on ICS Form 205A
- Fire and Emergency Medical Service organizations asked to provide resource needs, information requests and regional objectives to Emergency Support Function (ESF) 5 desk in the EOC, which will be staffed by Deputy Chief John Kaminski

- Established a 24-hour planning period commencing at 1000 hours each day
- The EOC will be operational daily from 0800 to 1700 hours and maintain the following schedule for daily planning and communication:

- Expanded security and hygiene protocols
 - Only personnel with incident specific badges will be approved for entry into the EOC
 - Prior to entry all personnel will be screened for fever and required to sanitize hands
- City of Toledo has placed a moratorium on residential water shutoffs and restored water service to all residential customers that have water disconnected for non-payment until the threat of COVID-19 is diminished
- Toledo Edison, Columbia Gas and Buckeye Cable System suspend disconnection of electrical, gas, and high-speed data service for residential customers unable to pay bills
- Established a single website to provide local information on community guidance to include testing protocols, resources, and closures and modifications to service delivery (<u>https://lucascountyhealth.com/coronavirusupdates/</u>)
- Established Lucas County Community COVID-19 Call Line, a 24/7 centralized phone number for the public to receive answers to clinical questions related to COVID-19

- Established an Outpatient Evaluation System

- Referrals provided via the Lucas County Community COVID-19 Call Line
- Referrals tested at a drive-thru site
- Only those who have been referred will be tested, all others will be turned away
- Referred individuals will be asked to self-quarantine while awaiting results
- Results provided in 3 to 6 days to patient, local health department and state health department
- Toledo-Lucas County Health Department asks religious organizations to begin to transition away from in-person ceremonies

Resource Needs and Information Requests

The following significant resource needs and information requests have been fulfilled:

- Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) template for pandemics provided to all organizations
- Forms for governmental organizations, businesses, non-profit and hospitals to track losses associated with COVID-19 provided to all organizations
- Provided guidance on access to unemployment benefits
- Provided guidance on appropriate laundering of uniforms
- Provide CDC guidance to public safety regarding optimizing PPE supplies
- Created and shared video providing guidance for public safety regarding approaching suspected infected individuals
- Published a list of COVID-19 call center resources for surrounding counties
- Toledo Community Foundation established a fund for financial donations to support local non-profits in their response to COVID-19

The following significant resource needs and information requests are outstanding:

- Numerous Person Protective Equipment (PPE) requests
- Guidance on inflection control at shelters

Incident Objectives

Daily Objectives

- Establish Incident Action Plan by 1000 hours
- Distribute Situation Report to organizations
- Provide daily media briefings at 1600 hours
- Encourage and support all organizations to plan and operate their own incident command branches and feed into the EOC via appropriate Liaison or ESF desk
- Receive, respond and fulfil resource need requests provided to the EOC
- Facilitate communication amongst all organizations
- Align and consolidate as best possible all public information through the Public Information Liaison
- Ensure accessibility of COVID-19 guidance to all Lucas County residents

The following objectives have been completed:

- Established rumor control and social media monitoring
- Coordinated modified governmental service delivery
- Coordinated remote work options for non-essential personnel
- Established a drive-thru outpatient evaluation center at Toledo Botanical Gardens
- Increased the capacity of the Lucas County Community COVID-19 Call Line

Our top objectives for the next planning period are projected as:

- Establish a PPE and general donations management process
- Establish a streamlined process for testing first responders and medical personnel
- Establish a process for quarantine of unhoused persons to include location and transport
- Establish protocol for deceased individuals related to COVID-19

The following other objectives have been identified:

- Quarantine location for first responders exposed to COVID-19
- Coordinate implementation of best practices for large construction and turn-around sites
- Discuss challenges posed by food insecurity related to COVID-19
- Support the needs of persons with access and functional needs
- Coordinate the documentation of the impact of COVID-19 on the local business community, understanding that impact on five sectors qualify the community for expanded federal resources
- Establish process for training and integrating EOC staff alternates
