# Randy Oostra ProMedica

Imagine two charts side by side, said Randy Oostra, President and Chief Executive Officer of ProMedica health-care system. On the left, is a description of ProMedica, a successful health-care provider in NW Ohio and SE Michigan, with 332 sites; 13

hospitals, and 17,900 employees. But on the right, Mr. Oostra said, is metro Toledo where 70% of adults are overweight, and has the highest infant mortality rate in Ohio. How do you improve the right side of the chart? The solution, he said, lies with improving the community. A community's "anchor institutions," have the ability to address tenacious community challenges and focus on the long-term welfare of the community. Anchor institutions are non-profit institutions—such as hospitals and universities— which, once established, tend not to move locations. The way to do that, Oostra said, is to change the 'I' in illness to a 'we' as in wellness, and do things from a well-being standpoint.

ProMedica has been advocating well-being by expanding beyond just being a hospital to being a health care "system". They invest in the community, provide education, financial services and public safety to name a few. The idea is, if they don't do those other things, they cannot create the right treatment for patients, they need to look at things as a whole.

ProMedica has been fighting obesity and hunger by starting food reclamation programs. They also provide food to their staff and those who cannot afford it, and have doctors writing "food prescriptions". They have also identified 'food deserts' in the city, where there is no access to fresh healthy food for those who live nearby. The Green City Market was built in one of these areas, bringing more than just a grocery store. There is a teaching kitchen, a call center —which brings more jobs to the area, job training and career skills, financial literacy classes, parenting classes, nutrition counseling and diabetes education. All these services that ProMedica provides are helping to improve the community as a whole.










## Welcome New Member: Jay Secor!

#### 2017 ROTARY LAKE ERIE WATERSHED CONFERENCE IS "ON THE ROAD"

Our district spans from the coast of Lake Erie in the north to the shores of Grand Lake St Mary's in the south - both threatened yearly by harmful algal blooms. This gives the members of District 6600 every reason to dedicate time and resources to working for healthy waters in our own communities.

For the third year, District 6600 is sponsoring an Annual Rotary Lake Erie Watershed Conference. This year our theme is "Water Conference On the Road" and will consist of a series of events at various locations around our district. Taking our conference "On the Road" will accomplish two goals; first, it helps make it possible for more members from even more clubs around the District to be involved and attend these water events and second it gets Rotarians out in the field to get our feet wet and our hands dirty with some real grassroots exposure to the causes and solutions of the Lake Erie algae issue.

#### Our First "On the Road" Conference Event will be:

#### Blanchard River Demonstration Farms Tour, Friday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>:

The Blanchard River is an important tributary flowing to the Auglaize and then into the Maumee River. Our host clubs (Findlay- Flag City and Ada) are inviting all of the other clubs in D6600 to join in a day trip and tour to 3 Demonstration Farms in Hardin and Hancock counties. Rotarians will meet and talk with the farmers as well as see their testing of new farming practices to reduce nutrient runoff to Lake Erie. Rotarians will board a bus to tour the three farms where they will be able to walk the fields and see the new farming practices as well as talk with the farmers themselves about how they are reducing nutrient runoff.
