Mr. Fore has served in the Bush Administration and was an Assistant Attorney General of Illinois and general counsel to the Lieutenant Governor of Illinois. Mr. Fore was also Executive Director of the Illinois Republican Party and has managed and advised numerous political campaigns throughout Illinois.

Mr. Fore served as a Judge Advocate General in the Illinois Army National Guard and US Army Reserve, honorably discharged with the rank of Captain. Mr. Fore was also elected and served as an alderman on the Belvidere, IL City Council.

Mr. Fore has been active with numerous community and civic organizations, including Rotary Club, Kiwanis Club, Big Brother/ Big Sister, Boy Scouts of America, and Presbyterian Church USA.

Mr. Fore has served as president of the national Board of Trustees of the Delta Sigma Phi Foundation and is a member of the Valparaiso University School of Law National Council. Mr. Fore gave the Commencement Address to the 2013 graduating class of Valparaiso University School of Law.

Mr. Fore was a Ronald W. Reagan Scholar and earned his B.A. degree at Eureka College. He received a Juris Doctor degree from Valparaiso University.

District Governor, Do Nguyen

District Governor Do Nguyen is a great example of how Rotarians can make a difference in the world. His father died before he

was born and his mother raised him to care, love and do good for others.

After receiving a scholarship from his government, he came to the US to attend BGSU in 1974, leaving his wife and infant daughter in Vietnam. Because of the fall of Saigon, he feared he would never see them again. However, in 1978, after 8 attempts to flee, they were reunited.

Do was asked to join Rotary five times prior to accepting in 1995. He realizes now that Rotary has changed his life and appreciates the effort Rotary places in world understanding and peace. In 2013 he won the Rotary Service Above Self award. DG Do helped establish the DOVE Fund—a nonprofit that builds schools and provides scholarships in Vietnam. Do has participated in numerous mission trips to many countries including Guatemala and his native Vietnam. In Guatemala, he could really relate to the children who didn't have clean and sanitary water, much like his own childhood.

DG Do wants to promote Rotary's values to elementary and high school levels by bringing the Four-Way Test to them. Rotary, he says, depends on younger members; we want to teach our children the Rotary way. With good morals, we will have a better world.

DG Do Nguyen expects District 6600 to be well represented and featured at the international Rotary conference in Atlanta this year. He also said that he expects we will celebrate the last case of Polio. Stating, "we have to stay on the battlefield until we win".

Do Nguyen ended with the quote: "We should not leave our self alone. Rotary inspires to dream of a world like it ought to be".


Welcome New Member Dennis Sawan
