Bob Howell, Chief Executive Officer "SSOE Group – Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow"

Bob Howell of SSOE Group began his career with the firm in 1980. He was with the firm for 10 years before he left to purchase a mechanical construction company. Bob returned to SSOE in 1993 to

help "kick start" the firm's food sector. He was very influential in the expansion and growth of the Food, Pharmaceutical, and Personal Care sectors - growing the operation into its own Strategic Business Unit (SBU) in 2002, and ultimately taking the helm of all Industrial Process Operations in late 2004. Under his leadership, the Industrial Operations group grew significantly adding a number of Fortune 500 and International clients to the company's roster. Bob was named an associate with the firm in 1990 and a principal in 1999. He moved into an International Operations position in late 2008 to assist with SSOE's expansion globally, specifically in the Asia market. From October 2009 to December of 2014, Bob held the position of Chief Operating Officer (COO); he was accountable for SSOE's global operations. Bob was elected to SSOE's Board of Directors in December of 2006; he served as the Chairman of the Board from December 2007 - December 2012. Due to Board term limits, Bob was required to relinguish his Board seat in 2013 and became a nonvoting Board Advisor, he was re-elected to the Board in December of 2013 to begin another three year term. Bob is also a member of the Executive Management Team; Bob is also active in local area nonprofit Boards, this includes Read for Literacy-Board Executive Committee; Read for Literacy-Board member; University of Toledo College of Business and Innovation, Business Engagement and Leadership Council; University of Toledo Engineering College Corporate Partners; Toledo Science Society; International Boxing Club & Learning Center; 22<sup>nd</sup> Century Committee; Downtown Toledo Development Corporation; Toledo Public Schools Foundation Board. His wife, Barrie, and he have 3 children, Harold III, Craig and Bailey.

## Past Program: August 29, 2016



#### Clyde Scoles, Toledo Public Library Director & Fiscal Officer

Clyde Scoles spoke about the library's role in a world where modern technology is rapidly increasing. As Mr. Scoles pointed out, books have been their 'brand', and the publishing

industry isn't going away. However, the library does need to continue to grow.

As an extension of the library's community involvement, they have created successful partnerships with local educational and cultural organizations. Some of these include Metroparks Toledo, the Toledo Museum of Art and Toledo Public Schools.

Mr. Scoles explained that the Toledo Lucas County Public Library follows several core values: Easy Access to Content and Privacy. Education— the library is open to any and every one, while the Ready to Read van brings the library to the community, offering access to learning for all. The library practices fiscal responsibility and receives funding from sources such as the State of Ohio and the Library Legacy Foundation.

Mr. Scoles said library construction has increased nationwide within the past 20 years. The new branch on King Road will be completed in October 2016. This \$7.2 million project will be more like a "library of the future". Scoles said they are viewing changes to the library by thinking in terms of what do they want to happen in a certain space, as opposed to what do they want to put in the space. To encourage children to read, an interactive children's area has been added, offering a special place for kids to learn. Keeping up with growing technology, the new branch will also have a health and wellness touch screen kiosk for all visitors to use. There will be a café and a drive-thru window for pick up and drop off of library materials. The new King Road Branch will "highlight the most state-of-the-art technology available in a space that fosters creativity and collaboration".

## John Keller Clement Sr.



John Keller Clement Sr., age 101, died Sunday, September 4, 2016, at Sunset House. He was born June 29, 1915, in Toledo to the late Carl H. and Faith (Keller) Clement. John graduated from Cranbrook School in Bloomfield Hills, MI and Cornell University in

Ithaca, NY. He had an inherent love of learning and at age 100 took an online course through Cornell. He was a veteran of the United States Army during World War II.

John was not a typical centenarian! He tracked his daily exercise with a Fitbit and carried an iPhone—always the latest one! He grew up in Toledo and studied engineering at Cornell. When he finished his degree in 1938, he came home to work with his father at the Bock Laundry Machine Co. and later ran the business with his twin brother, Carl Clement.

He was a longtime member of the Rotary Club of Toledo, beginning January 1, 1951—65 years! He served on several committees including, Attendance, 'At the Ready', Classification, Friendship, Greeters, House Committee, International Services and Strive in 2001. He rarely missed a meeting, attended almost every ITZA Ball, arriving one year with his new iPhone, showing it off to those at his table and wowing them with the ability to snap a picture and email it to them instantaneously!

He said of his 100th birthday celebration, the hardest part about getting to 100 was making it to 100! And, as it turned out, he exhausted himself with too many parties leading up to this 100th, didn't make the Rotary meeting that day for the big cake which had to be delivered to him at Mercy Saint Anne's where we learned the real story of his absence—he had so many cards, so many balloons, so much partying, he had to take a rest!

He enjoyed sharing his knowledge of computers and technology and always had a good one-liner to share with fellow Rotarians—he will be missed!
