overcome these challenges, primarily recycling


contamination, and improve your recycling habits.

BRIAN KENNEDY, THE FUTURE ROLE OF TOLEDO MUSEUM OF ART

On Monday, January 14th, Brian Kennedy, Director and President of the Toledo Museum of Art, brought to life, once again the gem we have in downtown Toledo as he presented the facts of the past and the direction of the future surrounding the growth and continued revitalization of our downtown along with the continued revitalization of the Toledo Museum of Art.


TMA is the 2nd most visited art museum in the U.S., per capita by population, after the National Gallery in Washington D.C. which is mostly tourist; Brian asked, "What is it about this city that makes people want to get involved?"

TMA has been responding to the change of the last 100 years. The first great museum was the British Museum in London, established in 1753 *built for the public education of the studious and for public recreation of the curious*. Brian shared the comparisons surrounding the structure of art museums ad 'Temple-like--big, grand, huge columns, intended to edify--gather and house the greatest objects made and found all over the world, across time, across cultures--people would come from far and wide--to be uplifted!

TMA's institutional master plan calls for a focus on 'relevance & sustainability' and to do that TMA will unify the campus by strengthening the museum's relationship to the community, celebrate the anchor spaces, improve circulation, increase the visibility and visitor experience.
