#### Bad HABit: Harmful Algal Blooms in Western Lake Erie

A documentary and outreach video project which aims to draw national, regional and local attention to the issue of Harmful Algal Blooms in Lake Erie. Our focus will be the intersection of HAB science, agriculture, policy, and public health. The film will showcase how scientists are working collaboratively and bi-nationally to understand the scope of the HABs problem, while examining productive ways agriculture can mitigate their contributions to phosphorous loading. What can we do in the short term? What must happen in the long term? Is science influencing policy? What is science telling us about the threat? In what innovate ways are conservation districts and farmers implementing to be better care takers? What tools or mechanisms are we implementing now to keep the public safe and to protect a way of life? These and other questions we will explore in detail as we weave together a dynamic story.

This is new documentary project which will leverage existing relationships within the

scientific, policy and agricultural communities. The work of these organizations would continue regardless, however we feel that having a tool which is designed to communicate these important issues will benefit all of the organizations

involved.






