Girls on the Run 5K Signage & Fencing

The Girls on the Run 5k is the culminating celebratory event of a life-changing 10-week program for girls in 3rd-8th grade. Girls on the Run of Northwest Ohio's first 5k in 2012 was for 22 girls and this May we will have over 700 girls completing the program and over 1600 participants at the 5k. As we grow, our need for prominent and durable signage at our 5k is growing as well. We are looking to purchase branded arches and feather flags to help attendees easily find the places they need to go on race day, eliminating much confusion and congestion. The arches will be used to designate the team meeting area and the starting line. Once the girls enter the team meeting area the feather flags will direct them to the area where their specific team is meeting. We are also requesting rolls of mesh fencing to use in the finish line area keeping spectators from accessing the area. As our 5k events grow, we have noticed it is becoming difficult to keep the finish line area safe as the crowds like to congregate in this area.

All supplies are durable and will last 5-10 years, setting us up for long term success. If we are awarded this grant we would be able to have the supplies in time for our Spring 5k on May 18, 2019.







Custom Orthotics

Using scanning equipment and scanning software, the Orthotist will now scan their patients body part and save the scan file on an external hard drive or on the cloud. The process takes only minutes and is very clean, requiring no plaster wraps or fiberglass.







Smart Wearables

Orthotics embedded with thermal and pressure sensors that can point out specific areas of the feet that have insufficient blood supply.

Supporting smartphone application would alert the wearer if one area of the foot is not getting blood supply. Such technology would greatly minimize the risk of amputations.


