Its goal is to honor the memory of Claire Rubini through literacy programs, including author/illustrator presentations in area schools and recognition events for students who have demonstrated a marked improvement in reading literacy, culminating in three distinct festivals in Defiance, Maumee, and Toledo. The focus of this application is the Claire's Day Teen Writing Program, which delivers creative writing workshops to students grades 6-12, and publishes a book of teen written work, the "Springboard Teen Literary Journal," published annually at the Claire's Day Festival.






