Toyota Camry for the Community Living Program

This request was for \$10,000 to support expanded community engagement opportunities for residents in Bittersweet's Community Living program. The Community Living program is home to 23 adult residents who receive around-the-clock staffing from a dedicated team of Direct Support Professionals. Project funding has be used to purchase a 2016 Toyota Camry, provide 450 additional hours of one-on-one staffing for community outings, and offset event costs (e.g. movies, concerts, sporting events) for residents unable to afford additional outings.




