ROTARY ON THE ROAD 180TH FIGHTER WING

The 180FW is responsible for the nation's number one homeland defense mission, Aerospace Control Alert, 24/7/365. Reporting to NORAD, this critical mission consistently proves to be an essential, long-term solution for the defense of our nation. With 60 percent of the U.S. population lying within a 600 mile radius of Toledo, the 180FW has flown more than 900 missions since activated in 2008. The 180FW has 10 Airspace and Air Traffic Control Assigned Airspaces, or ATCAA, areas available, along with five designated Military Operating Airspaces and four restricted airspaces within a 240 nautical mile radius. Included in these designated areas, the 180FW has access to air-to-ground gunnery ranges suited to the capabilities of both the F-16 and the F-35A. Both Alpena Airspace Complex in Michigan and Buckeye Airspace, Ohio, are supersonic, chaff and flare capable with full ground radar control and Link-16 capability. Link-16 is an electronic communication and data link between aircraft that allows pilots to communicate without the need to talk over radio frequencies in an effort to minimize detection from adversaries. In addition, the wing has access to three aerial gunnery ranges in Atterbury and Jefferson, Indiana, as well as Grayling, Michigan. All are approved for employment of precision-guided munitions, allowing the 180FW to maintain combat readiness with air interdiction, close air support and air defense missions. Utilizing multiple airspaces and ranges that are geographically separated allows the wing to find the favorable weather necessary to maintain training requirements and operational readiness at all times.




Local Program


Women's Initiative of United Way networks and mobilizes women to be leaders, advocates and philanthropists on issues relating to women and children.

Parents reported reading more to their children after enrolling







Children were more interested in reading after enrolling in Imagination Library

Kevin P. Mullan, VP New Development at Thread Marketing Group received a 2019 20/40 Leadership Recognition Award Tuesday night; he was among 200 nominees. Kevin joined Toledo Rotary in 2015.

Kevin also runs his own consulting business; launched Tapped 419, Toledo's first Fire Truck w/beer taps on the side; and fills in as public address announcer for the Mud Hens, Walleye & Rockets.

He recently earned the CFRE certification in recognition of his professional accomplishments & ethics in the fundraising profession. He has raised over \$10M throughout his career. In 2018, he received the Award of Heroism from the Safety Council of NW Ohio for his role in saving the life of Dr. Mitchell Greenbaum after an accident on I-280. As CEO of the Community Partnership, a local drug prevention coalition, he and his team designed a workshop called Hidden in Plain Sight which alerts parents to the dangers that might be "hidden" in their children's bedrooms.

His volunteer endeavors include serving as board president for Partners in Education, a 2nd term as board president for the Eastern Maumee Bay Chamber of Commerce and is a Toledo Rotary Board Director. In 2008, he and his wife Dani founded Toledo Unleashed, the non-profit organization that ultimately built Toledo's first dog park.

Kevin also serves on the Peace, Membership, Engagement and Marketing Committees of our Club.

Rachel Gagnon received the 2019 20/40 Leadership Recognition Award Tuesday night. Rachel joined Toledo Rotary in 2017.

Rachel is COO for Sunshine Communities and has successfully managed a \$5M plus community integration project for individuals with developmental disabilities. She also implemented a medical ventilator infrastructure expansion to support ventilator-dependent individuals and developed a manager trainee program for aspiring leaders within the organization.

Gagnon went to The Ohio State University and then to Capital University Law School where she graduated Summa Cum Laude, was elected to the Order of the Curia, earned the Dean's Excellence Award for 3 years and was an Adoption & Child Welfare Law Fellow.

In our community, Rachel serves as an advisory board member for the Open Table Toledo Foster Care Initiative, a member of United Way's Women's Initiative, a member of Truly Toledo's planning committee and has done volunteer work in Morocco where she also acquired and managed a USAID Grant for a water development project.


Rachel also serves on the Member Engagement and Youth Service Committess of our Club.


