ROTARIAN AMY WACHOB WORKING BETTER TOGETHER

Rotarian Amy Wachob will introduce the board approved and supported, Disability Services committee's new project, **Working Better Together.** Supported by the Disability Services Committee, this endeavor encourages fellow Toledo Rotarians to hire and/or provide on the job training opportunities for individuals with disabilities.

Working Better Together brings the resources of the Epilepsy Center, Lott Industries, Goodwill, and The Ability Center together to find community-based job opportunities for individuals with disabilities served by these organizations. The four organizations have partnered with Goodwill to provide a single point of entry for Rotarians interested in hiring persons with a disability or learning more about the program.

The four partners of Working Better Together are long time members of Toledo Rotary and see this program as an extension the Club's long history of serving individuals with disabilities. Examples include; building Glendale Feilbach School, founding The Ability Center, sponsoring Mudhens Day, Imagination Station Day, Zoo Day, and the annual grant vetting process by the Disability Services Committee.

Working Better Together will profile individuals with disabilities in the Spoke who are looking for work, with monthly progress updates given from the floor. This unique partnership will succeed based on Rotarians willingness to stretch their comfort zone to pursue service above self. If we execute well, we will end a history of 70% unemployment among this population, as we create a model that can be replicated by other clubs!

SUPREME COURT

Chief Justice and Six Justices

Court of last resort on state constitutional questions of public or great general interest; appeals from the Public Utilities Commission, all death sentences; original jurisdiction in select cases.

COURT OF APPEALS Twelve Districts, Three-Judge Panels

Appellate review of judgments of common pleas, nicipal, and county courts; appeals from Board of Tax Appeals; original jurisdiction in select cases.

COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS In Each of 88 Counties

Civil and criminal cases; appeals from most administrative

Domestic Relations

Juvenile

Probate

Divorces and Offenses involving solutions; support and custody of children.

Decedents'

MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY COURTS

Misdemeanor offenses; traffic cases; civil actions up to \$15,000.

COURT OF CLAIMS Judges Assigned by Chief Justice

All suits against the state for personal injury, roperty damage, contract and wrongful death; compensation for victims of crime. Three-judge panels upon request.

MAYOR'S COURTS

Not courts of record. Violations of local ordinances and state traffic laws. Matters can be reheard in municipal or county courts.


