MIKE BEAZLEY CITY OF OREGON ADMINISTRATOR

OLD ENERGY, NEW ENERGY AND THE REGIONAL IMPACT

Please Join us on Monday to hear Mike Beazley, City of Oregon Administrator talk about how energy impacts the regional economy. The Toledo area produces most of Ohio's gasoline and is currently producing the lowest price electrical power in the United States. Mike will talk about how the local energy has attracted billions in new capital investments in regional facilities. Also he will discuss Oregon's Clean Energy program which offers low priced natural gas and is therefore host to the largest solar manufacturer in North America. Mike says, "Our region is poised for continued energy based growth- as long as we're able to predict the future!"

Mike joined the City of Oregon's Administration in March of 2010. He has served in various leadership positions in local government and public policy for over 25 years. BOB CLARK-PHELPS CITIZENS CLIMATE LOBBY

Bob is part of an organization called the Citizens' Climate Lobby that is working with diverse groups of people to come up with some answers. The solution must have bi-partisan support – so policies don't change from one administration to the next.

Bob talked about what he believes is the best proposal, a

carbon fee and dividend program. The idea is to assess a fee on fossil fuels at their source or port of entry. Those fees would then be returned to U.S. households. The fees would start at \$15 a ton for carbon dioxide, and grow by

\$10 a ton per year. The plan protects low and middle income families, and stimulates the economy as the dividends are spent. Calculations predict the plan would lead to a 90 percent reduction in greenhouse gas emissions, 2.8 million new jobs over 20 years, and 200,000 lives saved over 20 years due to less pollution.

In Ohio, climate change takes the form of excess rain from heavy downpours and higher temperatures – which add up to harmful algal blooms. According to Clark-Phelps, the Cincinnati area has experienced seven 100-year floods in the last 14 years. While the warmth and rain are creating a longer growing season now in Ohio, in the long run the trends will suppress crop yields. Sixty percent of Ohio's electricity is still made from burning coal. But natural gas is not clean energy. It also creates carbon dioxide emissions. Click on the link above to view the meeting in its entirety
