MICHAEL BEAZLEY ADMINISTRATOR CITY OF OREGON

Mike Beazley the City of Oregon Administrator talked about how energy impacts our regional economy. The Toledo area produces most of Ohio's gasoline and is currently producing the lowest priced electrical power in the United States. Mike shared with us how the creation of local energy has attracted billions in new capital investments in regional facilities. Mike addressed Oregon's Clean Energy program which offers low priced natural gas and is therefore host to the largest solar manufacturer in North America. Mike says, "Our region is poised for continued energy based growth- as long as we're able to predict the future!"

Mike joined the City of Oregon's Administration in March of 2010. He has served in various leadership positions in local government and public policy for over 25 years. He teaches both graduate and undergraduate courses including Political Leadership and Local and Regional Government. Mike and his wife Julie have 4 adult children and 9 grandchildren.
