**ALEX MEJIRTSKI
SPECTRA PHOTOPOLYMERS
3D PRINTING IN A TIME OF CRISIS**



Alex Mejiritski, President and COO of Spectra Photopolymers will be our guest speaker next Monday. Spectra was founded by Toledo Rotarian Dr. Douglas C. Neckers in 1991. Its first objective was to print medical models for surgical planning from CT and MRI scans. Among early examples was the use of stereolithography to produce 3D models from CT scans of mummies collected by founders to the Toledo Museum of Art in 1906. The company has evolved into a full-on photoscience expertise provider.

Gov. Mike DeWine on Wednesday, April 15, announced an emergency initiative to manufacture swabs and swab kits needed to test for the coronavirus in partnership with several groups, including a Toledo-area 3D printing firm Spectra subsidiary of FormLabs.

The Millbury Ohio-based Spectra has developed an organic catalog containing more than 2,000 compounds and specializes in solutions in the photosciences, UV/EB radiation cure, and organic synthetic chemistry. The first order of 15,000 3D printed swabs for virus test kits were delivered to Ohio State, with a target of 200,000 swabs and swab kits to be shared in partnership with hospital systems in Ohio, allowing more people to be tested, the governor said. Doug Neckers believes that Spectra may be able to produce some 100,000 swabs per day utilizing their modern 3-D printers.

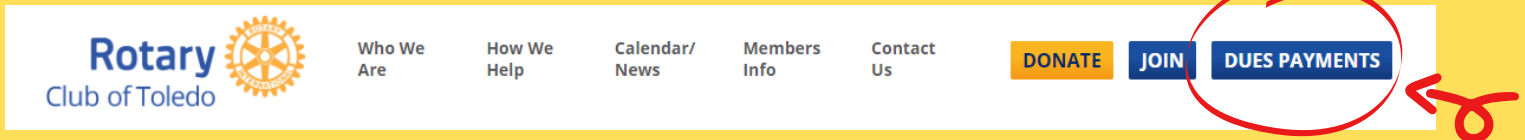

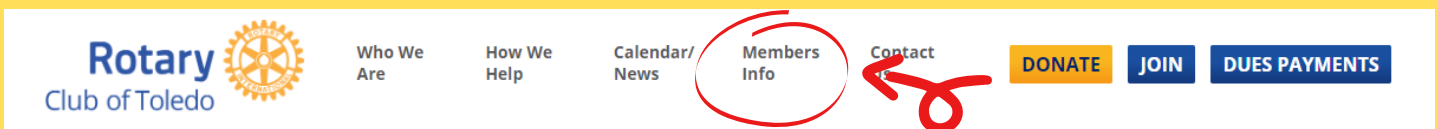

How to pay your dues



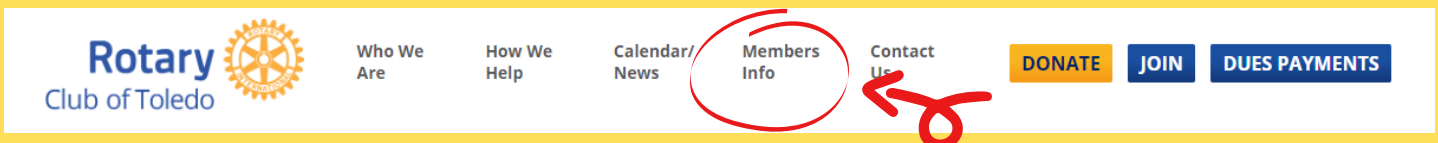

How to find the Monday Meeting ZOOM LINK



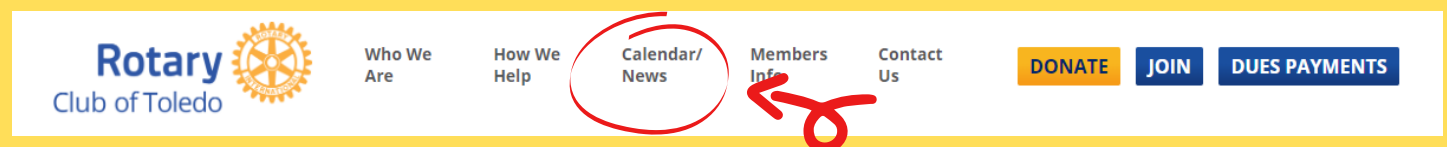

EQUITY & SOCIAL JUSTICE OPEN DISCUSSION LEAD BY PRESIDENT TIM RYAN

On Monday Rotarians hosted a roundtable discussion regarding social justice and systemic racism affecting people throughout the world during these changing times. The discussion was opened by President Tim who read the following statement drafted by several members of the Peace Committee: *Toledo Rotary has no tolerance for racism. Racism is real. Racism is not political. Racism is a human rights issue. Promoting respect, celebrating diversity, demanding ethical leadership, and working tirelessly to advance peace are central tenets of our work. The Toledo Rotary's Peace Committee, made up of Rotarians and non-Rotarian community leaders, has and will continue to support organizations taking action to promote social justice.*

President Elect Alex Due shared his commitment to our Club to continue these conversations at a deep level with a strong focus on diversity and inclusivity. Peace Committee Chair, Rachel Hobson offered insight and the future direction of our Peace Service Committee. Featured presenter was Diana Patton, Social Justice Advocate & Author.
