Toledo's Museum of Art: Past, Present, and Future.

The Toledo Museum of Art (TMA) has appointed a familiar face to the Toledo area arts community, Adam M. Levine has been chosen to step in as the next Edward Drummond and Florence Scott Libbey director of the Museum. Levine returned to TMA May 1st from the Cummer Museum of Art & Gardens in Jacksonville, Florida, where he was the George W. and Kathleen I. Gibbs Director and Chief Executive Officer. While there, Levine raised more than \$11 million and increased attendance and membership by 20 percent. Prior to his post at the Cummer Museum, which began in October 2018, Levine served in several roles at TMA since 2013, most recently as deputy director and curator of ancient art. Levine graduated summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Dartmouth College, where he majored in anthropology, art history and mathematics & social science. He continued his studies as a Rhodes Scholar at the University of Oxford, where he earned his master's degree with distinction and D.Phil. in the history of art. He publishes widely and is a frequent presenter on topics ranging from ancient art and interpretive strategies to museum and management practices. On the personal side, Adam states "I live in Toledo with my fiancée, Brooke, and 7-year old, Chase, who will be a second-grader at Maumee Valley Country Day School. My hobby, alas, is work at this stage in my life, but the most surprising thing to most people seems to be that I was a Golden Gloves boxer and boxed for Oxford while there."

ALEX MEJIRTSKI SPECTRA PHOTOPOLYMERS 3D PRINTING IN A TIME OF CRISIS


Alex Mejiritski, President and COO of Spectra Photopolymers was our guest speaker Monday June 22nd. Alex told the story of Spectra and how it was founded by Toledo Rotarian Dr. Douglas C. Neckers in 1991. Its first objective was to print medical models for surgical planning from CT and MRI scans. Among early examples was the use of stereolithography to produce 3D models from CT scans of mummies collected by founders to the Toledo Museum of Art in 1906. The company has evolved into a full-on photoscience expertise provider.

Gov. Mike DeWine on Wednesday, April 15, announced an emergency initiative to manufacture swabs and swab kits needed to test for the coronavirus in partnership with several groups, including a Toledoarea 3D printing firm Spectra subsidiary of FormLabs.

The Millbury Ohio-based Spectra has developed an organic catalog containing more than 2,000 compounds and specializes in solutions in the photosciences, UV/EB radiation cure, and organic synthetic chemistry.

The first order of 15,000 3D printed swabs for virus test kits were delivered to Ohio State, with a target of 200,000 swabs and swab kits to be shared in partnership with hospital systems in Ohio, allowing more people to be tested, the governor said. Doug Neckers believes that Spectra may be able to produce some 100,000 swabs per day utilizing their modern 3-D printers.
