A Message from DG Keith Hodkinson:

I want to take just a moment to thank you for being a member of one of the most important organizations in the world. Rotary does a number of things for a variety of people. People of all ages, genders, religions, ethnicities, interests and so much more.

We have just begun our new Rotary year. Every July 1, it is the largest transfer of democratic leadership in the world. From Rotary International President, to District Governor to Club President a new group of leaders bring new ideas, new goals and new enthusiasm to our organization and its members. Take time to celebrate the freedom we have in our lives.

Keith has been a Rotarian for 36 years. In that time, he has served as President of the Tiffin Club twice. He is also a Paul Harris Fellow Plus One. Keith does a morning radio show at WBVI-Mix 96.7 FM as one half of the Keith and Dawn Morning Mix program.

In Rotary, Keith was one of the "Founding Five" that, in 1984, developed the Tiffin Rotary Community Auction, a locally televised auction that raises money for the Tiffin Rotary Foundation and Rotary International. In 2014, as past president and a member of the Tiffin Rotary Club Foundation he helped encourage the club to move into supporting major international efforts. In January 2015, Keith and 8 other Rotarians went to San Pedro Sula, Honduras and began a week long mission trip working with teenage girls at a small local orphanage repairing toilets, water pumps, computers, windows and general construction. Keith has a great love of rescue dogs and was the chief developer of the Tiffin Bark Park project, a 1.5 acre off leash dog park in Tiffin that in one year has grown to nearly 350 registered users. He serves as the non-profit corporation's president, raising funds for the park's ongoing maintenance and improvement. Keith is the father of 3 sons Eric, John and third son, Alan, who passed away in April 2020. Please join me in welcoming Keith Hodkinson our 20-21 District Governor.

Rotarians In The News

Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary International's president for 2022-23. A groundbreaking selection that will make her the first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones will officially become president-nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge her.

Jones says she sees Rotary's Action Plan as a catalyst for increasing Rotary's impact. "As we reflect upon our new strategic priorities, we could have never envisioned that our ability to adapt would become our North Star during what is inarguably the most profound time in recent history," Jones said in her vision statement. "Silver linings rise out of the most challenging circumstances. Using metric-driven goals, I will harness this historic landscape to innovate, educate, and communicate opportunities that reflect today's reality."

As the first woman to be nominated to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion....READ MORE HERE

ACTOR - ENTERTAINER
TOLEDO NATIVE



Toledo Rotary was honored to host Jamie Farr on Monday. Farr shared stories of the old days in Toledo and answered questions from our members. Jamie is truly a shining star from Toledo and we are proud to call him a home town guy!

Farr was born in Toledo, Ohio, to Lebanese-American parents Jamelia M. Abodeely, a seamstress, and Samuel N. Farah, a grocer. He and his family attended Saint George Antiochian Orthodox Church in Toledo. Farr's first acting success occurred at age 11, when he won two dollars in a local acting contest. After Woodward High School, where he was one of the standouts among his class, Farr attended the Pasadena Playhouse, where a Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer talent scout discovered him, offering him a screen test for Blackboard Jungle. He won the role of the mentally challenged student, Santini. With the encouragement of his Toledo mentor, Danny Thomas, he decided to become an actor. The park in Toledo where Farr used to hang out when he was younger was renamed "Jamie Farr Park" in his honor on July 5, 1998. About the park, he said, "I wanted to be an actor, a famous actor, and I wanted my hometown of Toledo, Ohio, to be proud of me." Farr spoke to about 400 admirers and was quoted in the New York Post: "Jamie Farr Park is certainly a highlight of my life and career. "Further exemplifying Farr's love of Toledo was his frequent mention of Tony Packo's hot dogs, a Toledo staple, on M*A*S*H. He also was shown in many episodes as a Toledo Mud Hens fan.
