"THE ELECTION & THE PRESS"

Please join us Monday, for journalist Keith C. Burris. Keith has been a journalist for over 30 years and has written widely on politics, government, culture, and the arts. He has written for publications ranging from Commonwealth to The New York Times. Keith worked for The Toledo Blade from 1986 to 1989, long before his current position. For 25 years Keith lived in Connecticut where, for 21 of those years, he was the editorial page editor of the Journal Inquirer, in Manchester.

While in Connecticut, Mr. Burris won the Allen B. Rogers Award for the best single editorial in any newspaper, regardless of size, in New England. The award was judged by the Nieman Fellows at Harvard. Keith is also the author of Deep River: the Life and Music of Robert Shaw and the editor of No-Fault Politics by the late Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy.

Mr. Burris has also taught at Washington & Jefferson College, West Virginia University, Penn State University and Trinity College in Hartford, Conn. Mr. Burris holds a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh and lives with his wife Amy, an artist and have three grown children.



CLUB HOUSE MANAGER
DETROIT TIGERS



On Monday October 5th, Toledo Rotary was pleased to host Jim Schmakel, Detroit Tigers Clubhouse Manager. Jim shared his local background and how it lead to working with the Tigers. He shared historical anecdotes about past players and managers. We got the insider view of working for a Major League baseball team!

For over 40 years, Jim Schmakel has been the Detroit Tigers' Clubhouse Manager. He joined the Tigers in 1978, after working at the AAA Toledo Mud Hens' Clubhouse. Schmakel is a Toledo native as a former Toledo Central High School math teacher and basketball coach. He is also a graduate of the University of Toledo.

Schmakel was a batboy for the Toledo Mud Hens in 1966, which then was a New York Yankees' farm team. One of the pitchers was Jerry Walker, who would become the general manager of the Tigers and Schmakel's boss in Detroit.

Jim works year-round, travels and has a staff of 12. Schmakel loves that he has great flexibility in his schedule so he can catch a few innings from the Tigers' dugout! Jim says he likes his job because "Being on the inside of baseball is a lot different than being on the outside!"

Part of the job of a Clubhouse manager is taking care of the equipment and uniforms. Jim has been doing this for quite some time and says, now a good bat is around \$100 and he remembers when they were \$7!

His advice to youngsters is to stay connected. "You have to be nice to everyone you meet, Schmakel says. "You never know when you are talking to a future general manager."



## Here's What's Cookin'!

## Slow Roasted Salmon with Leeks, Parsnips & Crunchy Apple Slaw

#### Salmon Ingredients:

5-6 ounce portion of Salmon, skin and bones removed Ora King, Wild Alaskan, or Canadian Salmon sea salt

fresh ground pepper

1 tablespoon local honey

2 tablespoons melted butter (grass-fed preferably)

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

fresh chopped thyme (optional)

#### Vegetables Ingredients:

- 2 cups leek hearts, chopped
- 1 cup parsnips, peeled and cut into ½ inch pieces
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

### Warm Fall Apple Crepe with Cinnamon and Sugar

#### Apple Filling Ingredients:

- 2 apples peeled, sliced, core removed
- 2 tablespoons whole butter
- 1 tablespoon sugar

#### Crepe Batter Ingredients:

- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup flour
- 3 large eggs
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- Pinch of sugar
- Pinch of salt

#### For cooking:

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
