"THE IMPORTANCE OF ADOLESCENCE MENTAL HEALTH IN EDUCATION"

Keary Sarabia was born and raised in North Toledo to Ruben and Mary Sarabia. Keary's father's family migrated from Texas to Toledo where Keary attended Woodward High School. While at Woodward Sarabia played football and received; All-City Lineman of the Year, All-District Lineman of the Year and was First Team All-State. Keary started his post secondary education at the University of Toledo, but transferred to the College of the Desert to play football where he graduated.

Keary returned to Toledo after college and became involved in a lifestyle that lead to addiction and eventually homelessness. After some time, he realized he had the inner strength he learned from sports, to change his life.

He did change his life. Keary says he found his true calling after putting himself through "self-inflicted adversity" and believes his experience allows him to reach others and empower people. Keary has been true to his word, and has worked in the mental health and recovery field for 20 years.

Keary is engaged to Janetta Stoiber and lives in Temperance, MI. He has a daughter Abigail and a beautiful granddaughter, Kimore.


Football & Fellowship

"THE ELECTION & THE PRESS"

On Monday, journalist Keith C. Burris joined the Rotary Club of Toledo via Zoom to share his expertise and insights into the current media landscape during this unprecedented presidential election. Keith gave an objective overview of how each candidate's approach differs and how the media responds. Several Rotarians had questions regarding the division in the election and the impact of the press. Keith talked of the responsibility of the press and how drastically it has changed over time in regards to elections. Keith has been a journalist for over 30 years and has written widely on politics, government, culture, and the arts. He has written for publications ranging from Commonwealth to The New York Times. Keith worked for The Toledo Blade from 1986 to 1989, long before his current position. For 25 years Keith lived in Connecticut where, for 21 of those years, he was the editorial page editor of the Journal Inquirer, in Manchester. While in Connecticut, Mr. Burris won the Allen B. Rogers Award for the best single editorial in any newspaper, regardless of size, in New England. The award was judged by the Nieman Fellows at Harvard. Keith is also the author of Deep River: the Life and Music of Robert Shaw and the editor of No-Fault Politics by the late Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy.

Mr. Burris has also taught at Washington & Jefferson College, West Virginia University, Penn State University and Trinity College in Hartford, Conn. Mr. Burris holds a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh and lives with his wife Amy, an artist and have three grown children.
