


#### "THE COVID-19 SURGE THROUGHOUT SPORTS"


On Monday, journalist Christine Brennan joined the Rotary Club of Toledo's noon Zoom meeting. Christine shared an in-depth overview of the impact on sports brought about by the 2020 pandemic. Christine presented her analysis through five major points.

Point 1: She stated the 2021 Olympics in Tokoyo WILL happen! She went on to explain the importance of the Olympics throughout the world and how it may look very different from past Olympics. Point 2: Brennan said she felt the Big Ten made a mistake playing this year as COVID runs through our communities. She talked about the college football landscape, this year's changes and the impact on colleges and universities. Christine's third point was, "Athlete protests will continue". She went on to explain the impact of Collin Kapernik kneeling a few years ago and how the NFL is working to address the social impact of the protests. Point 4: Brennan noted that, "TV ratings for sports has been down during the pandemic and will probably will never go back to where they were." Society has changed as to how they watch and participate in sports during COVID which has led to a change that will continue for some time.

Lastly, Christine talked about the demographics of sports and how it's changing. The impact of Title IX and girls in sports is increasing and making huge strides in what was once a male dominated "field". (pun intended).
