On Moday, March 22nd, please join us for John Muenzer who will share the story of his journey as a swimmer including his swim across the English Channel and his days at the University of Toledo as a college athlete.

John Muenzer is a native of Maumee and attended St. Johns High School and The University of Toledo. He represented The University of Toledo men's swim team from 1979 to 1983. He was named as one of the top distance freestyle and backstroke swimmers during this time. He was inducted into the UT hall of fame in 1992. After college, he continued to challenge himself in the water by swimming from Point Pelee in Canada to Cedar Point in Ohio in August 1983. The 34-mile distance was accomplished in 24 hours and 10 minutes, breaking the record that was set in 1957. John went into business, married his wife, Mary, and had 7 children. Due to these responsibilities his swimming goals were postponed. Starting in 2009 he returned to swimming and completed the English Channel crossing of 21-miles in 13 hours and 12 minutes. In that same year he swam the 24-mile length of Tampa Bay in 12 hours and 7 minutes. In August 2018, John returned to the water and swam the 28.5 miles around the Island of Manhattan in 9 hours and 22 minutes.

One swim remains to accomplish the triple crown and grand slam of long-distance swimming. The swim is from Catalina Island to Long Beach, California for a distance of 20.5 miles. John's goal for this swim is August of 2022.

Please help us congratulate Judy on her upcoming retirement as CEO/President of Hospice Northwest Ohio. Hospice of Northwest Ohio announced the retirement of President/CEO Judy Seibenick RN, MOL effective this spring. Mrs. Seibenick's retirement comes after 40 years of service to the agency, more than 20 of those years as President/CEO.

Judy has been with Hospice of Northwest Ohio—a non-profit agency and first Medicare certified hospice in Ohio—since its inception in 1981. One of its three original nurses, she paved the way for this little-known agency and form of care, ultimately becoming Executive Director in 2000 (title changed to President/CEO in 2019). Hospice of Northwest Ohio has grown from serving a handful of patients with a staff of five, to caring for more than 400 patients a day with a staff of 400, plus 165 volunteers. Most of this growth has occurred under Judy's leadership and has been carefully managed to preserve the agency's compassionate culture and commitment to highest quality care.

Judy and her husband Kurt have built a new home in Southern Ohio so they can be close to children and grandchildren. She plans to relax and enjoy all that retirement brings.
