**Judge Christine E. Mayle**  
**6th District Court of Appeals**

Judge Christine E. Mayle received her J.D. degree, cum laude, from the University of Notre Dame Law School in 2001, and her B.A. degree, summa cum laude, from Providence College in 1998.

Upon graduation from law school, Judge Mayle practiced law with Dewey Ballantine LLP in New York City for several years. She then moved to Toledo and joined the law firm of Cooper & Walinski LPA and, subsequently, Thacker Robinson Zinz LPA. While in private practice, Judge Mayle represented companies in litigation across the country and internationally, helped individuals pro bono, and served on various charitable and legal-aid boards.

Judge Mayle was elected to the Sixth District Court of Appeals in November 2016. In 2017, she was elected by her colleagues to a two-year term as Presiding Judge of the court. In 2018, Judge Mayle was appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Ohio to serve as a visiting judge on that court, to decide *The Cincinnati Reds v. Joseph W. Testa*, Tax Commission of Ohio, Case No. 2017-0854.

Judge Mayle has volunteered for several community and professional organizations. Currently, she serves on the Executive Committee of the Ohio Court of Appeals Judges Association, and as an elected member of the board of the Toledo Bar Association. In addition to her service on the TBA board, Judge Mayle is also an active member of several Toledo bar committees, including Bar Admissions, Kiroff Bench-Bar, and the Diversity, Inclusion, and Race Equity committees. She is a sustaining member of the Junior League of Toledo. She previously served as Editor-in-Chief of the American Bar Association Section of Litigation's Woman Advocate Committee's award-winning newsletter, *The Woman Advocate*. She is a member of the Toledo Women's Bar Association, Wood County Bar Association, and the American Inns of Court, Morrison R. Waite Chapter.

Judge Mayle and her husband Andrew have three children.

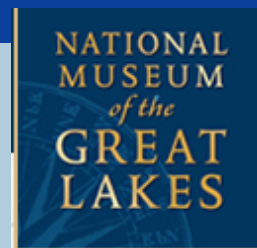

### Junior Achievement - Preparing Our Students For The Global Economy

On Monday, Jack and Jim shared their vision for Junior Achievement both nationally and locally. They explained how JA is not the same JA that existed 25 years ago, as it is more than just an introduction to business. The focus of JA is to prepare kids for the future with practical skills and knowledge about the various paths one can take after high-school. The JA program strives to teach today's students three basic pillars; financial literacy, entrepreneurship and work preparedness. Jack is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Junior Achievement USA. Junior Achievement is the world's largest organization dedicated to giving young people the knowledge and skills they need to own their economic success, plan for their future, and make smart academic and economic choices.

Today, JA reaches nearly 4.8 million students per year in 105 markets across the United States, with an additional 5.2 million students served by operations in 100 other countries worldwide. Kosakowski has total oversight of Junior Achievement in the United States.

Starting as a student in the Junior Achievement program in Toledo, Ohio, Jack attended the University of Toledo on a Junior Achievement scholarship and has since served in a variety of staff positions with increasing levels of responsibility over the past 40 years. He was named President and CEO of Junior Achievement USA in 2007. Jack was appointed by President George W. Bush to serve a two-year term on the President's Advisory Council on Financial Literacy in January 2008. He serves on the Board of Directors of the Achievement Foundation, is a past member of the United States Commission for UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization), and serves on the Council on Competitiveness' Learn to Compete Commission. Kosakowski was also named a Trustee of America's Promise Alliance.

Jim Pollock, President, Junior Achievement of Northwest Ohio will also be joining the discussion on Monday. Jim states, "I wake up every day inspired to influence, educate and mentor students so that together we can change the world." Jim describes himself as an innovative thought leader who thinks differently and is a believer in the 'right-brain' creative mindset. He states, he is passionate about serving and helping others. Jim says what motivates him is to change the trajectory of student lives in a positive way and transform the narrative of the current education pathway. He is a business evangelist and strategist with over 25 years of experience as a professional in moving people for a cause.
