Dr. Romules Durant, Superintendent and CEO of the Toledo Public Schools, is a 1994 graduate of Waite High School. He went on to receive a Bachelor of Education degree in 1998, a Master's of Education degree in 2002 and a Doctorate Degree in Educational Administration and Supervision in 2007 from the University of Toledo.

Dr. Durant began his employment with TPS in 1999 and has served as a fourth grade teacher, a dean, an assistant principal, a principal and an assistant superintendent before being named Superintendent in December 2013.

Under his leadership, TPS has shown exceptional growth in the following areas: overall student and career technology enrollment, STEMM education and the development of several magnet schools and community partnerships. The district has also shown gains on the State Report Card in a number of key areas.

While his honors are many, Dr. Durant has never lost sight of the fact that he has the same goal for today's TPS students as he had for himself: to rise up from modest means and achieve success first in school, and then in life. - 1. Recognize that Environmental Sustainability is a new Rotary area of focus with Global Grant possibilities.
- 2. Encourage each Club to form an environmental sustainability committee
- Encourage each Club to advocate and be seen to advocate for the environment



When I say **DO SOMETHING**, it can be anything that creates environmental awareness and gets the committee functioning.

Here are a few ideas:

- Reduce plastics at Rotary meals and take pressure off the landfills
- · Ask an elected official to speak environmental issues
- Partner with your land trust or park to have them GPS tree saplings, identify the species and issue a frameable quality certificate with the land trust logo and a Rotary logo. The certificate would make clear that the tree was identified and located ia GPS in honor of an individual accomplishment that your Club wants to recognize. These could be the birth of a child or grandchild, a Paul Harris Fellow, an outgoing Club President, whatever is appropriate. The certificate would serve to create legacy and a bond between the recipient and Rotary.

I am sure that the Clubs will come up with more and, no doubt, better ideas. The Perrysburg, St Mary's, Milan, and Toledo Clubs have already started.


Thomas Gouttierre became a master pastry chef at 18 while working in a family bakery in Maumee, Ohio. He and his wife Marylu went to Afghanistan in 1965 as Peace Corps Volunteers; they returned in 1969 when Tom received a Fulbright Scholarship. In 1971 Tom became Executive Director of the USA Fulbright Foundation in Afghanistan.

Gouttierre served as Dean of International Studies & Programs(IS&P) and Director of the Center for Afghanistan Studies at the University Nebraska Omaha from 1974 until he retired in 2015. He also served as Dean of IS&P at the University Nebraska Medical Center from 1987 until 2010.
