Ambassador (ret.) Yoram Ettinger Israeli Researcher and Diplomat The Ettinger Report

Iran's Ayatollahs reflect Middle East violent intolerance. Their anti-US vision and policy are driven by a 1,400-year-old history." "Their ambition is not limited to the Persian Gulf and the Middle East, but extends all the way to Latin America and the US-Mexico border. Is the US avoiding or repeating mistakes, which have been committed since the 1978/79 Islamic Revolution?"

Ambassador (ret.) Yoram Ettinger has served as a diplomat, researcher, writer, lecturer, consultant, dedicated to education through well-documented, out-of-the-box and politically-incorrect thinking on US-Israel relations, Middle East affairs, the Palestinian issue, the Iranian threat, Jewish-Arab demography.

A Consultant to US and Israeli movers & shakers on US-Israel relations and Mideast affairs since 1993, 3-5 annual visits to the US – two to five weeks each - for briefings, lectures and interviews. He is the author of a weekly English and Hebrew politically-incorrect brief/article, analyzing the mutually-beneficial US-Israel cooperation, US-Israel mutual threats and challenges, the impact of the Palestinian issue on US interests, Middle East turbulence and the Jewish-Arab demographic balance.

As a co-founder of the America-Israel Demographic Research Group, he has exposed the myth of the Arab demographic time bomb, while documenting an unprecedented Jewish demographic tailwind resulting in frequently interviews by Israeli and US TV and radio via zoom and in studio. In 1989-1992 he was in-charge of Israel relations with the US Congress – with the rank of Ambassador - at Israel's Embassy in Washington, DC. Prior work includes 1988-1989 Director of Israel's Government Press Office, coordinating relations with overseas journalists.

In 1985-1988 Ambassador (ret.) Yoram Ettinger served as Israel's Consul General to the Southwestern USA, based in Houston, Texas, furthering ties with politicians, clergy, businessmen, independent oil producers, ranchers, Hispanic, Black, Christian and Jewish leaders and organizations in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico. He has widely lectured on US politics as part of the Hebrew University Executive MBA Program. Other credits include 1997-2000 Alabama Trade Representative in Israel. 1976-1985 Yoram was head of a Middle East research unit in Israel's civil service, and editor of the Contemporary Mideast Backgrounder, a newsletter, disseminated to policy-makers and public opinion molders in Hebrew, English, Spanish, French and German. The newsletter dealt with Mideast politics, US policy in the Mideast, international terrorism, the Palestinian issue, etc.

Ambassador (ret.) Yoram Ettinger has a M.S. in International Management, UCLA (1971)., CPA (certified by the AICPA), California (1970) and a B.A. in Business Administration, Univ. of Texas at El Paso (1969).

He is Married to Ora with three daughters, Tal, Adi and Deganit and three grandchildren - Noga, Roni and Guy.




