First Solar is a leading American solar technology company and global provider of responsibly-produced ecoefficient solar modules advancing the fight against climate change. Developed at R&D labs in California and Ohio, the company's advanced thin film photovoltaic (PV) modules represent the next generation of solar technologies, providing a competitive, high-performance, lower-carbon alternative to conventional crystalline silicon PV panels. Prior to joining First Solar, Mike worked at Dana Incorporated where he held several positions with global responsibility in operations and quality management. He earned a Bachelor of Science in chemical engineering from Case Western Reserve University and a Master of Business Administration from Bowling Green State University. He currently serves on the executive boards for Toledo's Science Center, Imagination Station and Lourdes University. Mike also serves on the boards for the Ohio Foundation of Independent Colleges, CWRU's Great Lakes Energy Institute and St. Francis de Sales School. Mike resides in Monclova, OH with his wife Jennifer and their children Katelyn, a senior at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh and Collin, a freshman at Ohio Northern University in Ada, Ohio.


The 2022 Recognition event is scheduled for Tuesday, October 25 at the Valentine Theatre.
