# Dedication and

Celebratory Lunch Rotary Riverside Nature Preserve Saturday, September 10, 2022 11 AM - 2 PM Red Barn Sales & Service S430 OH-109, Liberty Center, Ohio Rotarians, non-Rotarians, and guests Picnic lunch provided Group transportation to tree-planting site

These trees will act as a natural filtration for a cleaner Maumee River and restore the beauty of the area. The property contains frequently flooded farmland within the river's floodplain. Rotary Club funding along with District Grant totaled \$36,000.

The location is between Napoleon and Grand Rapids, Ohio, on the north side of the Maumee River. It is immediately west of a railroad bridge, and is currently referred to as the Maumee River Floodplain Property.

6,000 of the saplings will surround 600 bigger trees which will be bagged to ensure they survive.
