

### State of the Airline Industry Today

Born and raised in Toledo, Ohio Jim attended St Francis de Sales High School and was a 1987 graduate then went on to Xavier University to a BSBA Accounting degree in 1992. He was selected by 180th Fighter Wing/112th Fighter Squadron for USAF pilot training in November of 1992.

From 1993-1994 he served as St Francis Alumni Director. Then participated in USAF Pilot Training at Laughlin Air Force Base (AFB), Columbus AFB, Tucson AZ AIR National Guard Base (ANGB) during 1994 through 1997.

As a Pilot Ohio Air National Guard (ANG) Toledo, Jim served 22 years flying F16s for some 2000+ hours with 55 combat sorties on 5 Middle East Deployments (Operation Northern Watch, Operation Southern Watch, Operation Iraqi Freedom). Jim was 1 of 4 pilots who started Alert Squadron at Toledo AIr National Guard Base. After 23 years of total service Jim Dettinger retired from the Air Force Reserves at Wright Patterson AFB.

In October 2000 he was hired as a Delta Air Lines Boeing 727 Flight Engineer, was furloughed in 2002 along with hundreds if not thousands due to 9/11. He continued to fly military, charter and contract until he was hired at Marathon Oil Company in 2005 and flew their corporate aircraft.

He then returned to Delta full time flying the 757/767 flying both International and Domestic Routes based in Detroit and Atlanta. Worked in the Chief Pilot Office in Atlanta 2015 to 2018, then returned to line flying as a Boeing 717 Captain in Detroit which I currently serve as a Lead Line Check Pilot, B717 Fleet System Matter Expert in Human Factors, B717 Data Analysis Group, Delta System Board Representative, Delta Pilot Recruiting team member, and a Delta Pilot Ambassador.

Jim Dettinger currently resides in Fort Mill, SC (Charlotte,NC suburb) with his wife Laurie married 24 years. Laurie is a learning support teacher at St. Matthew Catholic School, Charlotte, NC. They have two Children: Alivia (20) and Emily (18) both attending college.
