

Very dear Rotarian friends,

I am deeply touched by the encouraging notes some of you sent me.

We are indeed in our Israel home, not too close geographically to the horrible events in the south, but very close in spirit.

Israel is facing a catastrophe of gargantuan proportion. so far over 1000 civilians slaughtered, butchered, raped, decapitated, including children, women and the old by Hamas barbarians, and over 2000 wounded many of them critically. The largest number of Jews murdered in one day since the Holocaust.

As you may know, for years Israeli leaderships believed that pumping money to them would deter them from their declared goal (Google Hamas Charter) to eliminate the State of Israel and kill all her Jews.

In 2005 Israel vacated all its communities and people, even cemeteries, from the Gaza Strip with the false hope that this will bring about peace. The result was thousands upon thousands of rockets showering Israel by the terrorist organization Hamas, supported by Iran, who took control of the Strip in place of the thriving Jewish communities that supplied work and prosperity to thousands of them. <u>Acres and acres of greenhouses</u> on the sands, all destroyed and sold by them for scraps when they took over.

The IDF is now, at long last, preparing to invade the Strip and hopefully eliminate this regime of Hamas/Isis barbarians once and for all.

We are bracing for many more casualties among our incredible young and brave soldiers.

This is the situation as I am writing these lines. Except for our aching hearts my wife and family are otherwise well.

President Biden carried a <u>deeply emotional speech</u> in full support of Israel. The bond between our two democracies is as strong as ever and unbroken. May it last forever.
