Lori Hauser has dedicated the last 20 years of her career to ensuring the presence of a vibrant, science center in Toledo. Under her leadership, Imagination Station, the nonprofit science center, has become a downtown landmark, providing education to school children and family entertainment for more than 200,000 people annually.

Under Lori's leadership, Imagination Station has experienced significant growth. When many non-profits faltered during COVID, the science center emerged stronger than ever. It reopened with a \$12 million capital expansion, featuring a state-of-the-art, largeformat theater that offers unique and immersive learning experiences. Her unwavering commitment to science education remained steadfast throughout the pandemic delivering virtual learning experiences to our schools, educators, students and families.

Lori's strength in cultivating and maintaining partnerships enriches the science center's programs, broadening the reach of the audiences it serves. Imagination Station was chosen as one of 15 museums for the 2016 National Medal for Museum and Library Service from more than 35,000 eligible institutions, acknowledging its outstanding community service. She has successfully secured competitive grants exceeding \$600,000, dedicated to advancing early childhood education and ensuring access to educational science experiences for children in underserved communities.

Ms. Hauser is deeply passionate about creating opportunities for girls and women in STEM fields and believes that girls need to see professionals who look like themselves. Her creativity introduced Girl Power, an annual science career day for young girls. Additionally, she partnered with the Association of Science and Technology Centers, bringing local and national female STEMinist role models to the science center to inspire girls in the sciences. Ms. Hauser also spearheaded the formation of Imagination Station's 'STEMinist" affinity group, that provides community STEM engagement and emphasizes the crucial role of girls and women in STEM professions.

Lori gives of her time and leadership skills freely by serving as Co-President of Toledo Area Cultural Leaders (TACL); a board member of ProMedica Russell Ebeid Children's Hospital and Destination Toledo; a member of Toledo Rotary; a member and past President of Press Club of Toledo, a 2009 nominee for 20 Under 40; and a recipient of the 2016 Woman of Distinction award from the Girl Scouts of Western Ohio. She is the 2023 YWCA Milestone Science Honoree.

Currently Lori is proudly catalyzing our region as Imagination Station prepares for one of the most noteworthy once-in-a-lifetime phenomena of science, Toledo's Total Solar Eclipse on Monday April 8.




