Pallets For Purpose: Toledo Helps Ukraine Supply Drive

Supplies will be collected July 29 – August 31. The following items will be collected for a shipment to Ukraine in September:

- Power and hand tools (cordless drills, screwdrivers, hammers, nails, saws, and wrenches)
- Tarps (polyethylene or vinyl)
- Work gloves (leather, Kevlar insulated, thermal-lined, or utility. Medium, large, and extra-large)
- Work boots (all types and sizes accepted including steel toe, insulated, or waterproof)
- Batteries (all types and sizes accepted)
- Flashlights (all types and sizes accepted)
- Canned goods
- Nonperishable foods
