Dr. Romules Durant, the CEO/Superintendent of Toledo Public Schools, stands as an inspiration for innovation and dedication in the field of education. As the 29th superintendent of TPS, Dr. Durant has exemplified an unparalleled commitment to his hometown of Toledo and his dynamic leadership has led the district on a path of success.

Last year, he celebrated his 10th anniversary at the helm of Toledo Public Schools, the fifth-largest school district in Ohio. 
