Join us for lunch on Monday, December 8th, when we are joined by Tom Seeman, author and Toledo Native.

Tom Seeman is a businessperson who has owned and led several businesses. He grew up in a family of fourteen on welfare and food stamps in the projects of Toledo, Ohio. He earned his B.A. in Economics from Yale, where he rowed on the crew team and graduated summa cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa, before going on to earn his J.D. at Harvard.

Tom currently serves on the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston and on the Board of Trustees of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. He funded a scholarship that actively seeks disadvantaged students to attend St. Francis de Sales High School in Toledo—the school that generously gave him a scholarship and that he credits for helping him fulfill his dream of attending a top college. He has worked across the globe, has lived in five countries, and has traveled to over one hundred.


He lives in Massachusetts with his wife, four children, three dogs, and a cat.

YOUR DOLLARS AT WORK IN TOLEDO, AND BEYOND!

Annually, the Toledo Rotary Club Foundation annually supports over 30 local and international nonprofit organizations by funding over \$250,000 in grants. Foundation funding is made possible through the generous contributions of members of the Rotary Club of Toledo and its friends.

This \$5,000 grant to the Salvation Army supported their Food Pantry and Diaper Bank, via updated shelving units and produce displays, as well as an upright cooler with glass doors to replace a broken refrigerator, essential to produce storage. Through this program, food insecure households have access to high-quality, well-rounded food choices. Demand for food continues to increase, largely attributed to an unforeseen increase in the number of working families seeking assistance. To meet this need, The Salvation Army launched a renovation of the food pantry, increasing capacity. This increased storage capacity, as well as stage produce to look more appealing and support healthy food choices. As the only Choice Food Pantry in the community, improving the storage capacity and display of food, most notably produce, encourages families to choose appropriate foods to their taste, lead them towards healthier options and limit food waste. Additionally, increased storage capacity and produce displays, guided by well-versed Salvation Army staff, supports meal planning and provides assistance to families in choosing foods from the pantry.
